This **Annual Report** tells a story of **resilience**. The pandemic may have curtailed us from gathering in person, but it didn't stop us from expanding our reach and impact.

AWB's beautiful **Jewish Inclusive Pride Flag** places our identity in the center. You cannot remove the star and still be inclusive!

Our **We Refuse to Choose** campaign took this flag to Pride celebrations from coast to coast, with a message that we will not be forced into any closets because of our support for LGBTQ or Jewish rights, including Israel.

More than 100 people participated in our **Virtual Missions**— and we didn't stop there. We launched **A Wider Lens** — reaching huge audiences with discussions about films, books, and food all at the nexus of LGBTQ, Jewish, and Israeli culture. And **10,000** of you joined us for **Virtual Tel Aviv Pride** in June!

The growing **AWB network** made its voice heard in 2021 when LGBTQ people faced hate including transphobia, when Jews faced violence, and when Israel was attacked from **Gaza**. Our alumni spoke out in social media, rallies, and op-eds.

Throughout, we helped share the voices of **LGBTQ Israelis** – as they navigated the pandemic, took cover from rockets, and showed us all what resilience really means. We are especially proud that we were able to expand the **AWB Impact Grants Program** – giving over \$180,000 to 17 Israeli LGBTQ organizations.

AWB's 10th Anniversary Celebration was a great success. We welcome you to watch it.

THANK YOU to our board, donors, alumni, partners, and participants who have helped AWB grow to have international reach. You make all this possible.










Why did we create a new flag?



During Pride rallies and marches, we at A Wider Bridge have proudly used a rainbow pride flag with a white Star of David. The pride flag has evolved to include inclusive colors. We didn't want just to add on those missing colors and the star in a way that they could be removed, either practically and symbolically. So, we came up with our new inclusive Jewish pride flag. The original pride flag, the inclusive colors, and the star each stand for inseparable parts of our identities. We cannot allow one to be removed just as we won't be excluded from either the LGBTQ community or the Jewish community.

For A Wider Bridge, our support for Israel is central to our Jewish identity and our LGBTQ identity. We believe that when one part of the community is excluded, we are all left weaker and less vibrant. Doing so contradicts the very idea of inclusivity.

We Refuse To Choose. We refuse to prioritize and rank the multifaceted components of our identities. Here is our new flag, and we invite you to wave it proudly with us.

In 2021, we're united under a new flag of Inclusive Jewish Pride. We pushed back against those who've been trying to define us, and we celebrated all of our identities, including our Judaism and connection to Israel. We took this powerful message "We Refuse To Choose" across the country, into the subways of New York, onto the streets of Chicago and San Francisco. Across Florida. We took our message to the water and into the skies.


